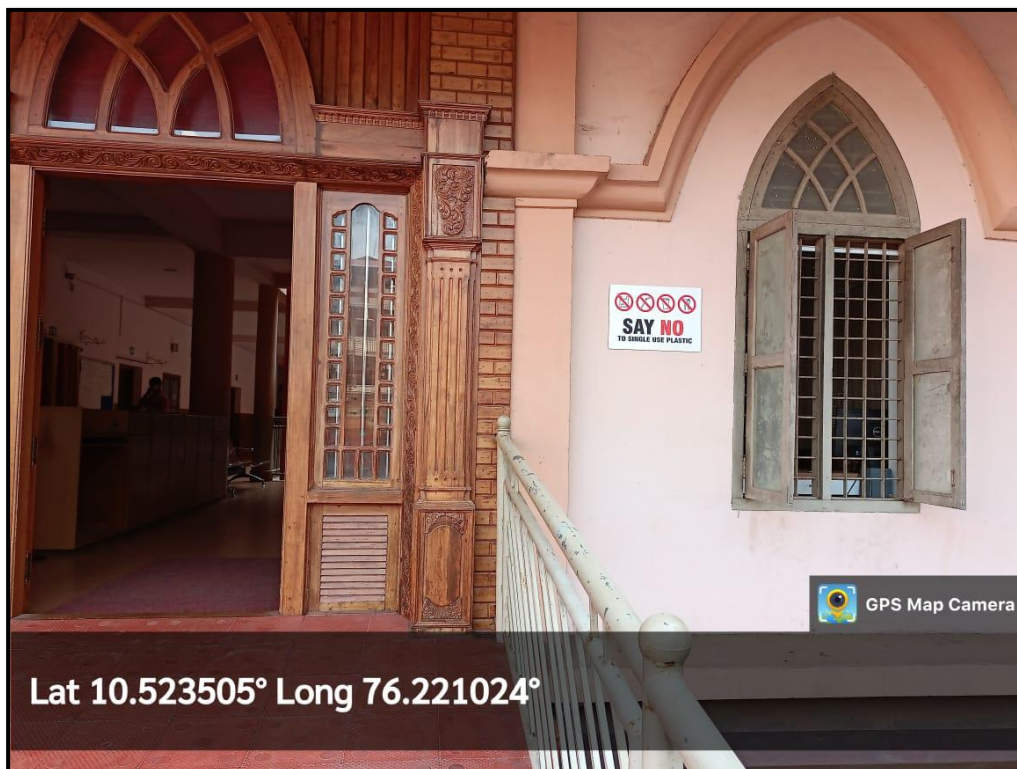
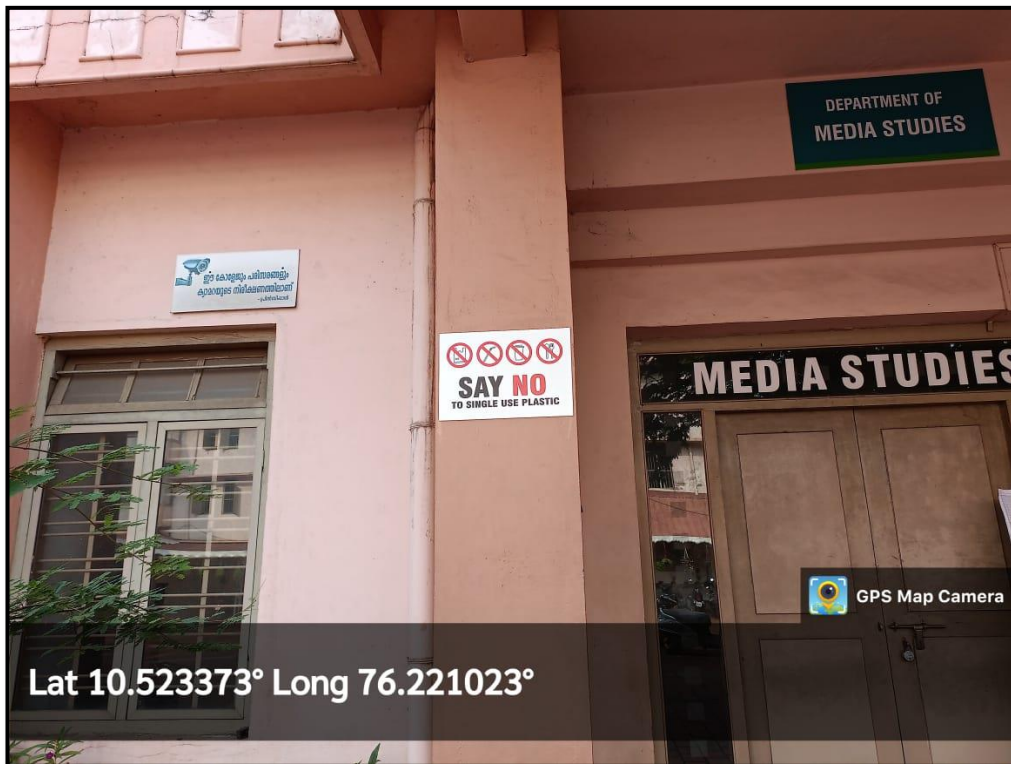
Board indicating Single used plastic banned in the Academic campus

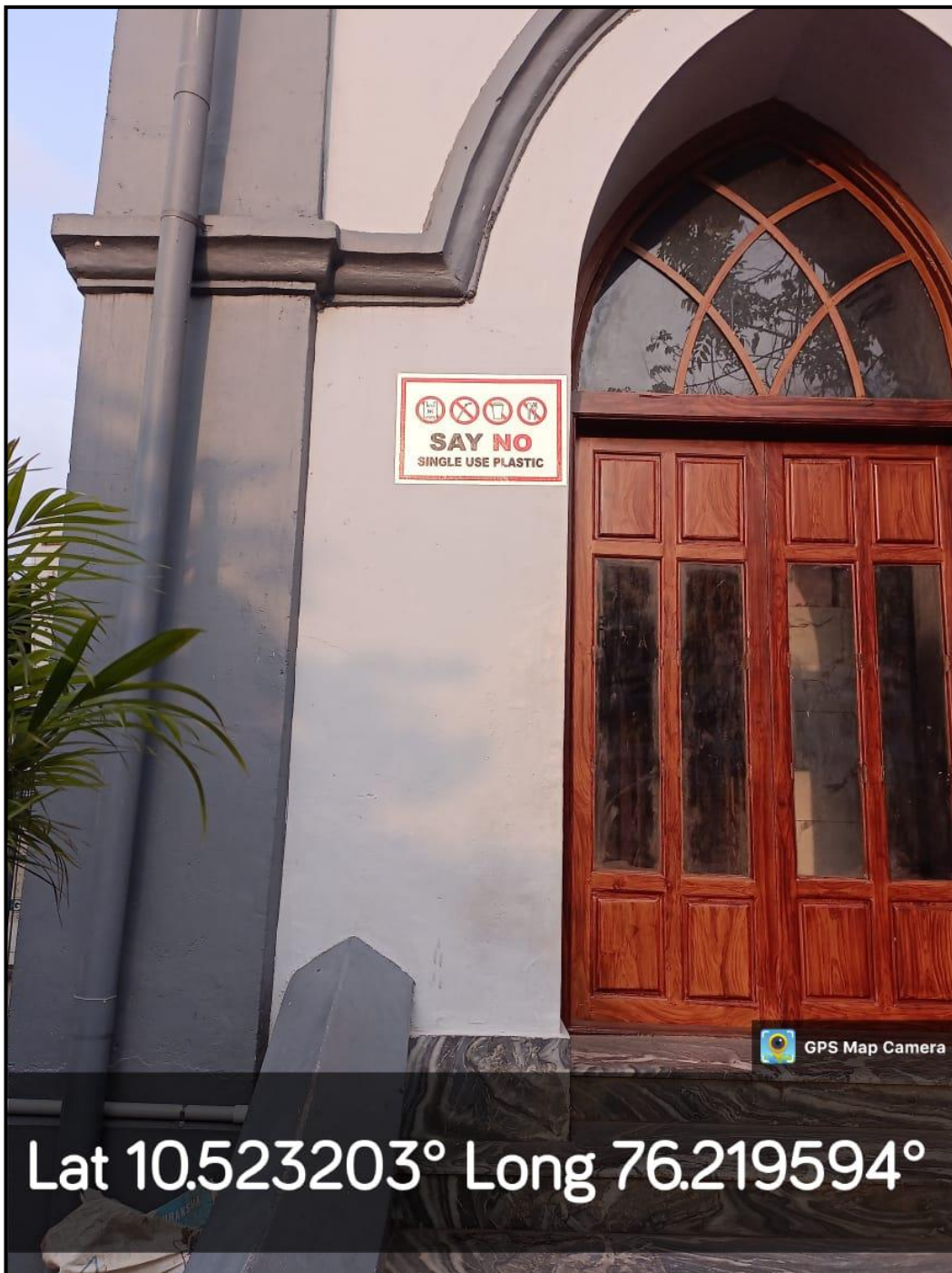

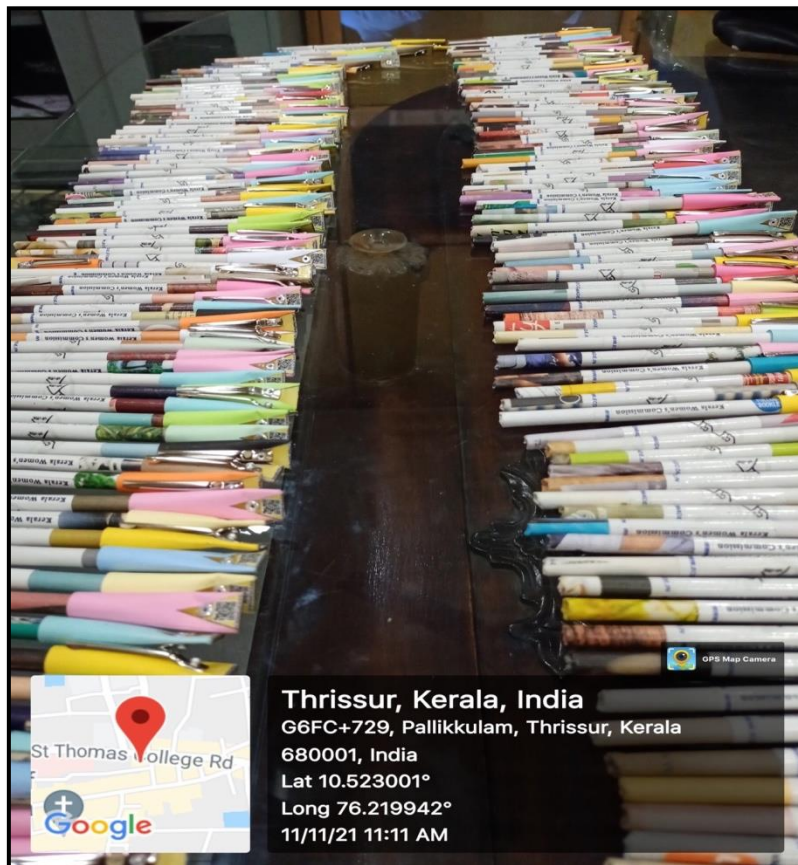

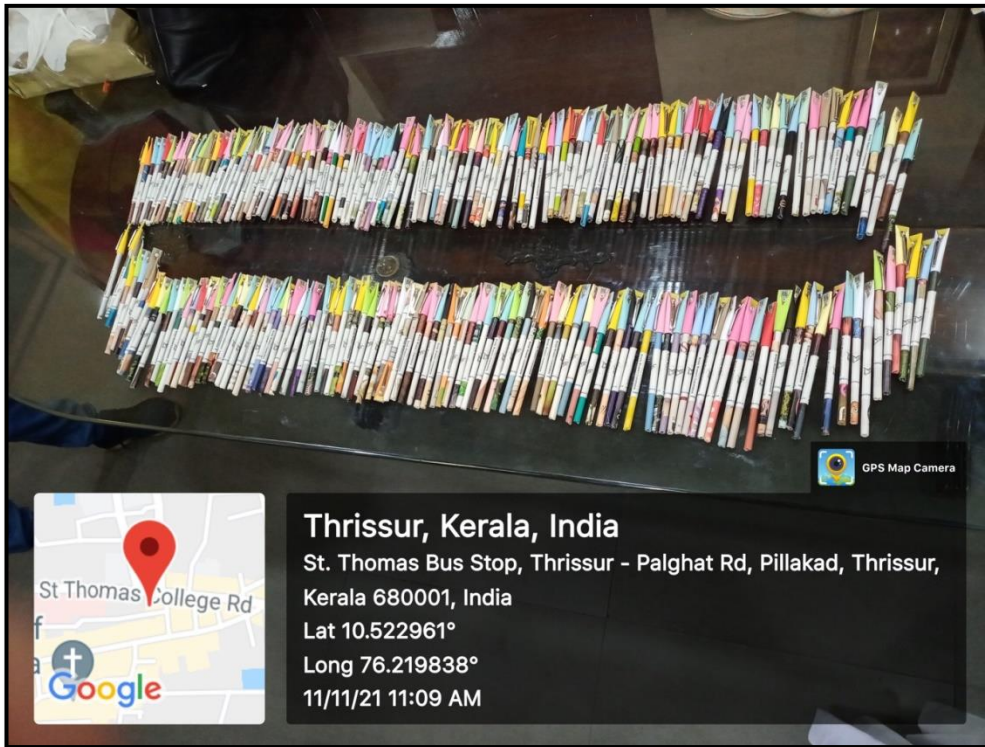

PAPER PEN BY RECYCLING WASTE PAPER

St. Thomas College (Autonomous) has added another milestone to the successful implementation of green-protocol initiatives a paper pen project. The idea of producing paper pens in the campus emanated from a green audit report which pointed out the accumulation of heaps of used plastics pens in different parts of the campus. Students of NSS with the leadership of Prof. Renjith took the challenge of producing paper pens for the campus community. More than 1000 pens have been prepared so far and distributed to students and teachers.

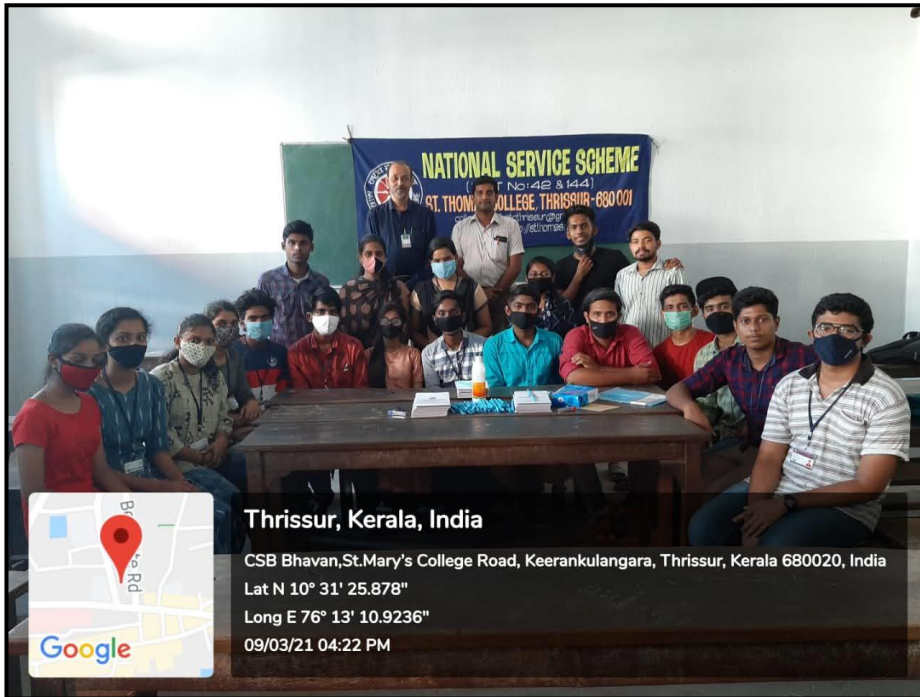

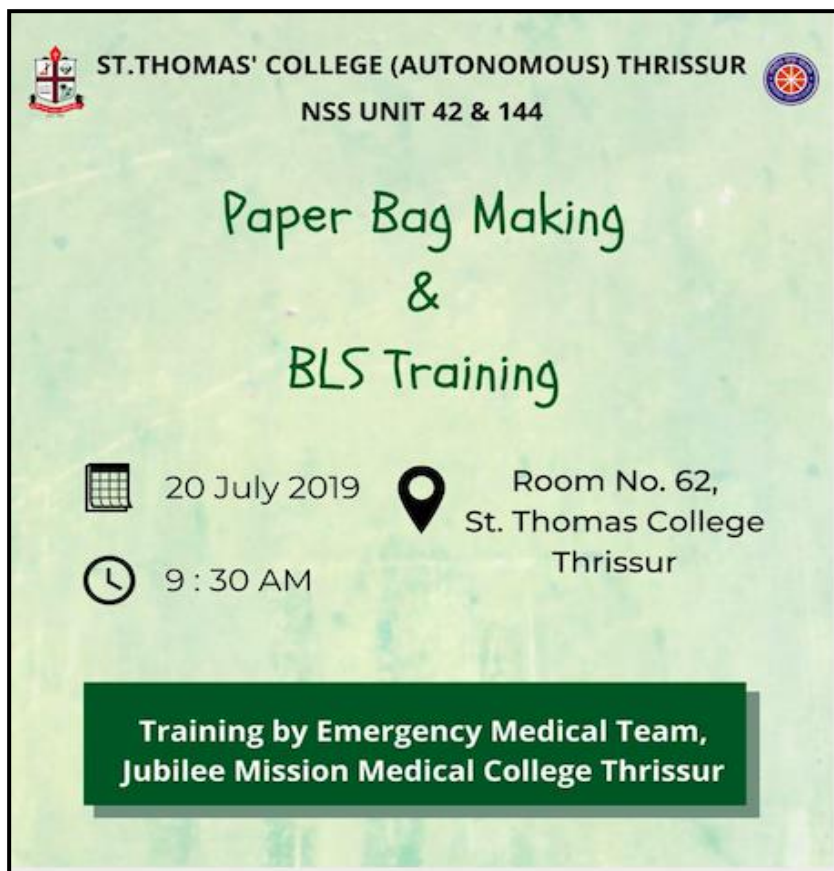
PAPER BAG MAKING

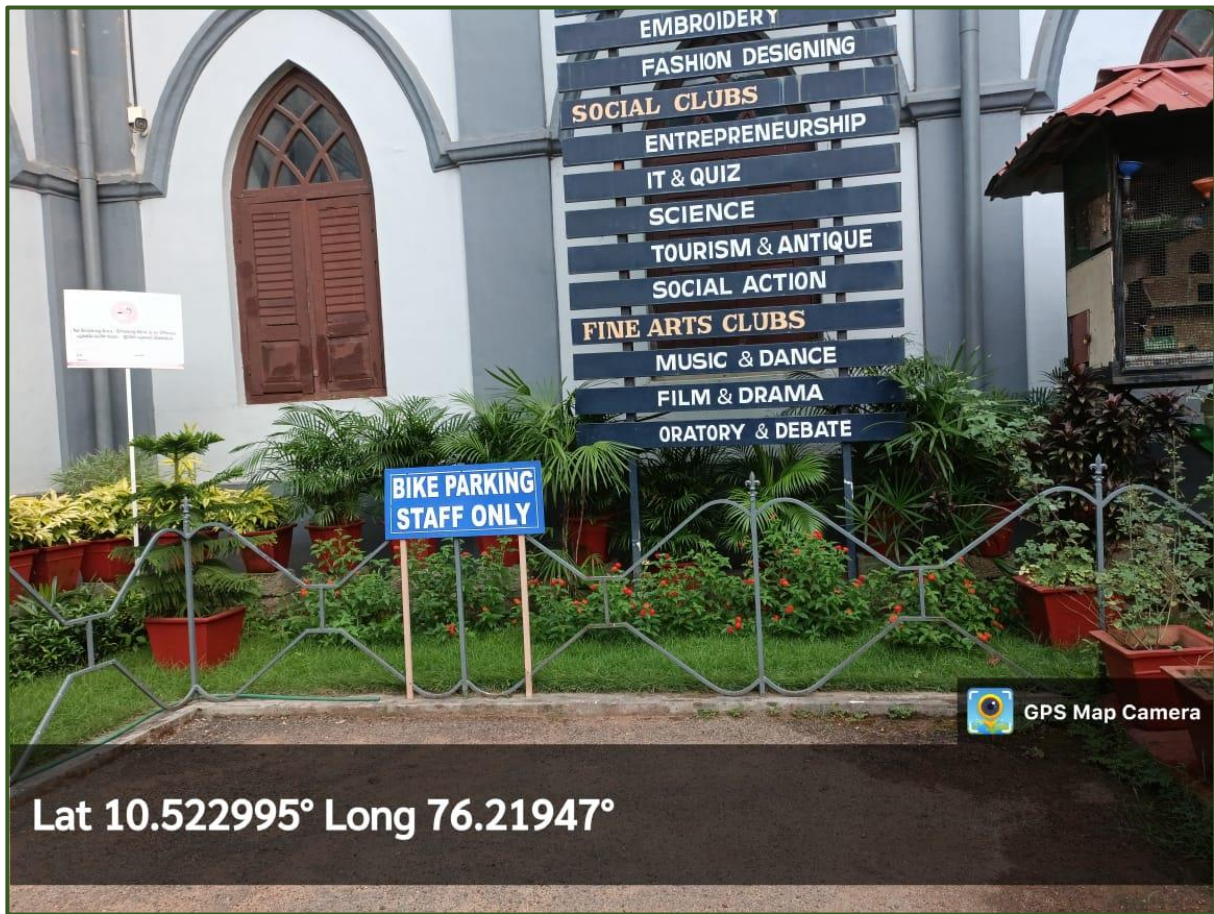

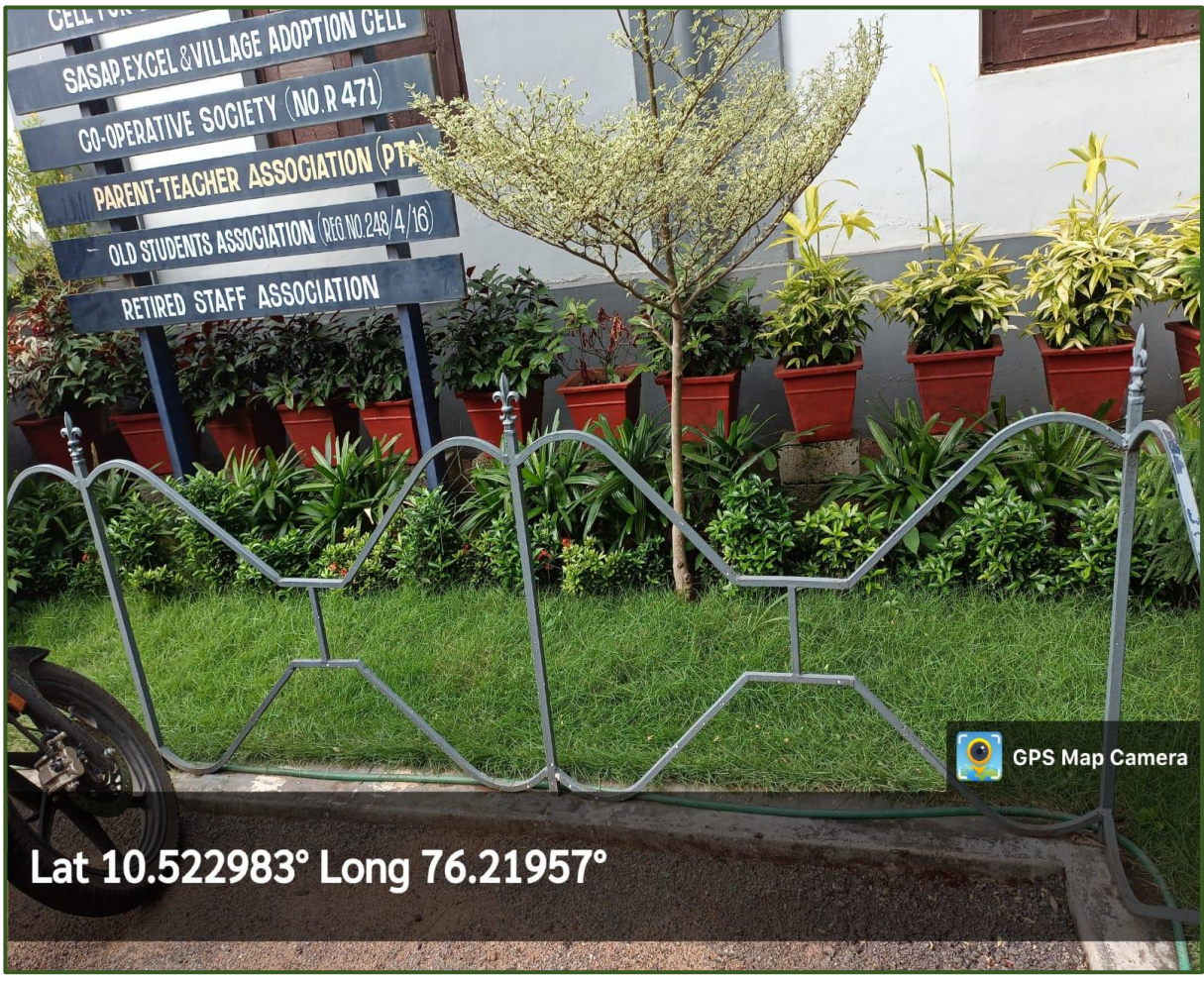

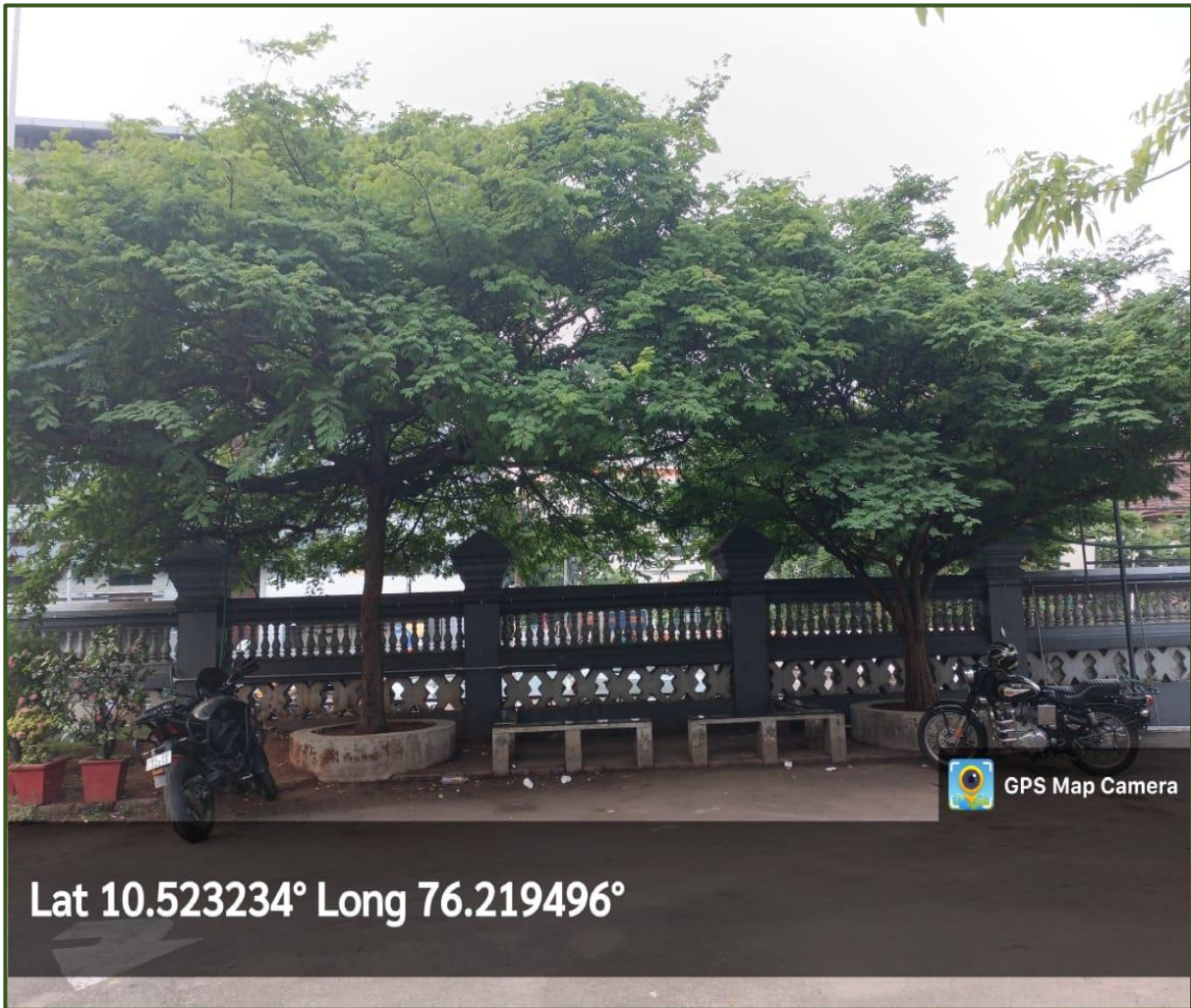

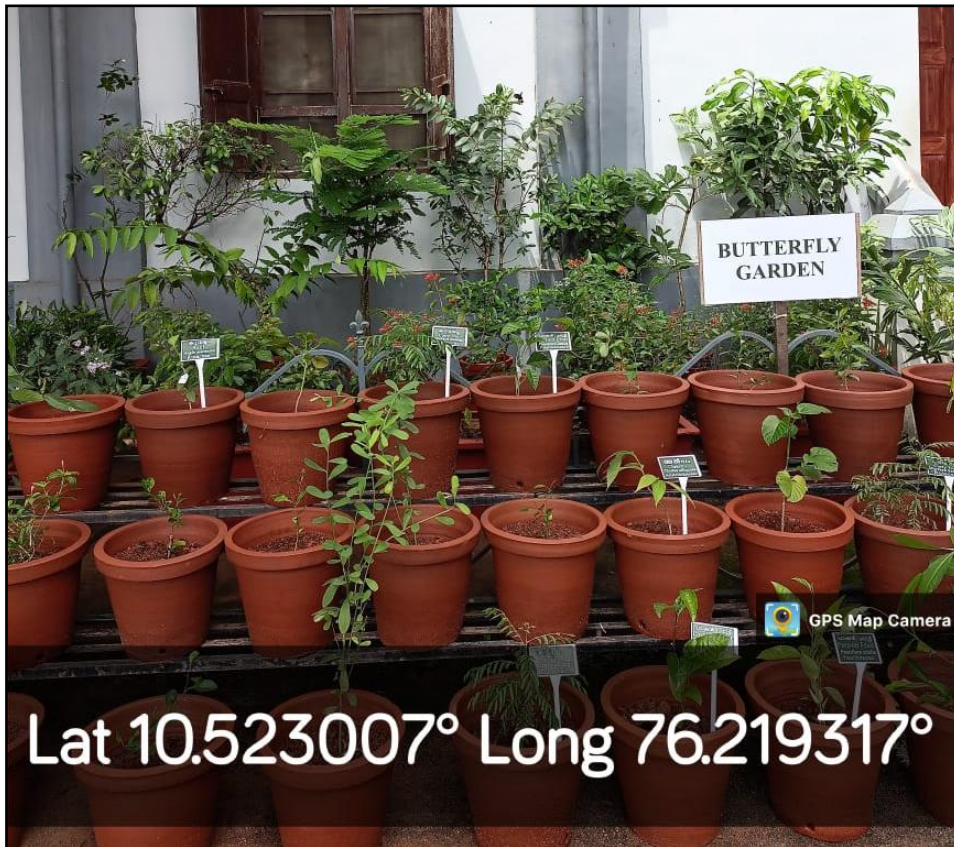
